CONCERTINA BOOK MAKING WORKSHOP

Autumn 2023

A high intensity workshop for those looking to learn about photo editing, storytelling and book making for photographers. The workshop asks participants to create a story line and build a small concertina book. Participants will have to, not only, work on their photo-editing skills but also create a mock-up book featuring the story developed in class. The workshop is based on the teacher's experience as an editorial photographer and graphic designer.

What is a concertina book? It is an origami-style pop up book where the individual pages are glued in horizontal sequence and the first and last pages are glued to the cover and back cover respectively

Skill Requirements? Yes. It is recommended that students are familiar with post-processing software (Lightroom, Darktable) in order to homogenize their story. It is also recommended that students are familiar with some sort of layout software such as Affinity Publisher, InDesign or similar. The teacher will help students with the software and design concepts but there should be some ease of use from the student side.

What material shall we bring?

Day 1: Up to 25 images draft printed in max 15x10cm. Laptop with your software of choice.

Day 2: Laptop with your software of choice.

Day 3: Layouts are printed in class with provided paper. Students bring: paper glue, glue applicator, cutting base, cutting ruler, cutting knife, paper creaser, scissors, 2mm grey compressed cardboard A4 sheet.

What about images? Students are asked to bring a maximum of 25 images to the first class for a story telling exercise that will reduce their number to the **10 images** that will be used to build the book.

Only 10 images? Trust us... that's plenty.

How is the course structured?

Day 1: Part 1, story telling exercise to select images and create a sequence. Part 2, design concepts and ideas to enhance the story created by the images.

Day 2: Part 1, design layout (creating a digital layout ready for print). Part2, printing.

Day 3: Cut and assembly of the book with concertina, cover and back cover.
